Simple Present Tense

Use it to state facts and describe habitual actions.
 Many Americans **work** part-time. (fact)
 Judy **swims** three times a week. (habitual actions)

Affirmative Sentences*	
I / you / we / they	Subject + verb + object
he / she / it	Subject + (verb + -s) + object
Negative Sentences	
I / you / we / they	Subject + don't + verb + object
he / she / it	Subject + doesn't + verb + object
Yes/No Questions**	
I / you / we / they	Do + subject + verb + object + ?
he / she / it	Does + subject + verb + object + ?
Wh... Questions***	
I / you / we / they	Wh... + do + subject + verb + object + ?
he / she / it	Wh... + does + subject + verb + object + ?

*Adding the verb an -s:
 -If the base form ends in **sh, ch, x, s, z, or o**, add **-es**: teach / teaches.
 -If the base form ends in a consonant plus **y**, change the **y** to **i** and add **-es**: worry / worries.

***To ask **Which**: Which + noun + do / does + subject + verb + object + ?
 ***To ask **Who**: Who + (verb + -s) + object + ?

**Answers for Yes/No questions:

Affirmative Short Answer	Yes, + subject + do / does.
Negative Short Answer	No, + subject + don't / doesn't.
Affirmative Complete Answer	Yes, + subject + verb (+ -s) + object.
Negative Complete Answer	No, + subject + don't / doesn't + verb + object.
