## Language Review

### Future with GOING TO

We use *GOING TO* + verb for plans we have decided on.

<b>Affirmative</b>	Subject + verb be + going to + verb + object
<b>Negative</b>	Subject + (verb be + not) + going to + verb + object
<b>Yes/No questions *</b>	Verb be + subject + going to + verb + object + ?
<b>Wh... questions</b>	Wh... + verb be + subject + going to + verb + object + ?

\*Answers for Yes/No questions:

<b>Affirmative short answer</b>	Yes, + subject + am / is / are.
<b>Negative short answer</b>	No, + subject + 'm not / 's not (isn't) / 're not (aren't).
<b>Affirmative complete answer</b>	Yes, + subject + be + going to + verb + object.
<b>Negative complete answer</b>	No, + subject + be + not + going to + verb + object.

### Future with WILL

We use *WILL* + verb for possible plans. *WILL* is often accompanied by other words to show possibility or probability (e.g., *I guess, maybe, I think, probably, I suppose, I expect, possibly*). We also use *WILL* for spontaneous offers and sudden decisions (e.g., *I'll bring my husband! I'll help you! I'll get the phone.*)

<b>Affirmative</b>	<b>Negative</b>
Subject + will + verb + object	Subject + will not (won't) + verb + object
<b>Yes/No questions *</b>	<b>Wh... questions</b>
Will + subject + verb + comp. + ?	Wh... + will + subject + verb + object + ?

\*Answers for Yes/No questions:

<b>Affirmative short answer</b>	Yes, + subject + will.
<b>Negative short answer</b>	No, + subject + won't.
<b>Affirmative complete answer</b>	Yes, + subject + will + verb + object.
<b>Negative complete answer</b>	No, + subject + will not (won't) + verb + object.
