

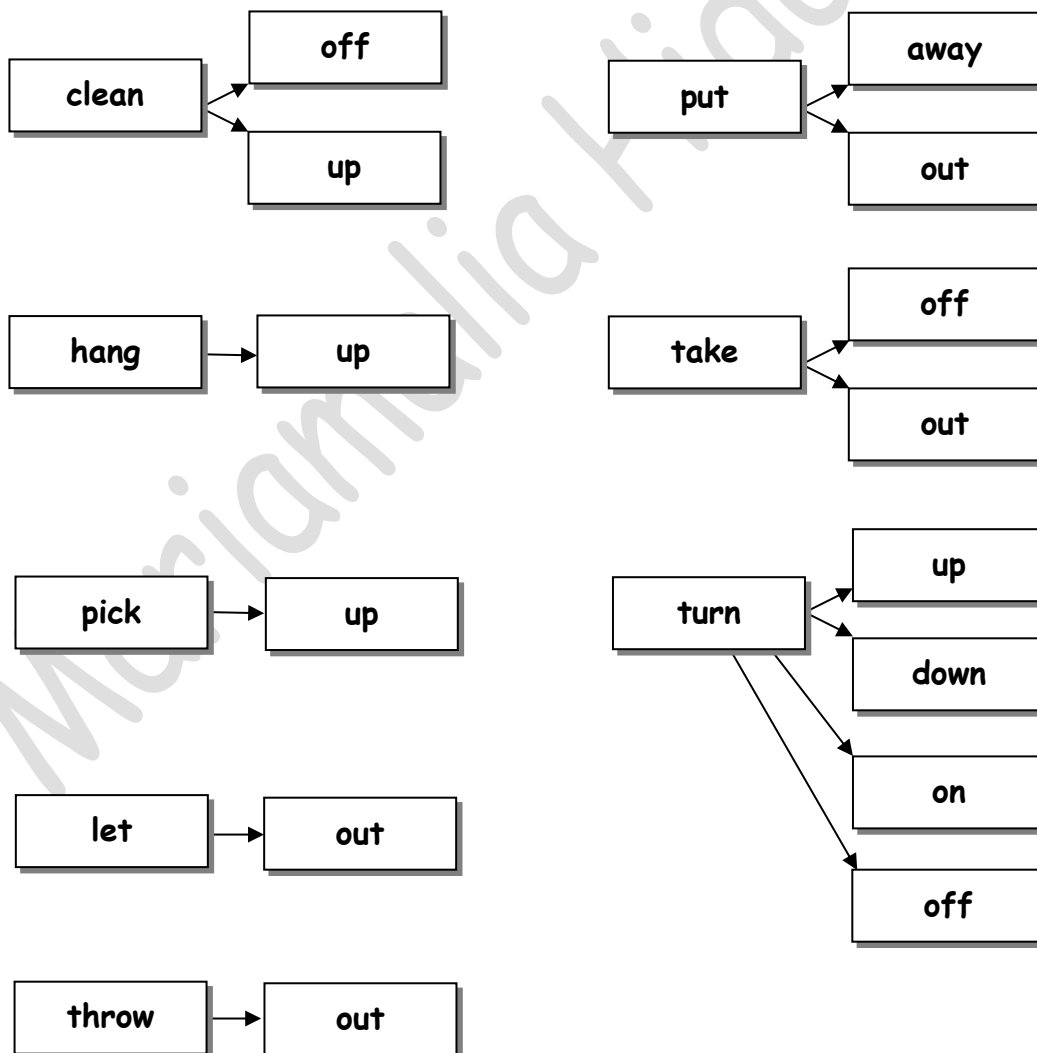

### Grammar

#### Two-Part Verbs

Two-part verbs are made up of a verb and another word called a particle, which changes the meaning of the verb:



The object (e.g. TV, books, etc.) can come before or after the particle:

Turn **the TV** down.  
Turn down **the TV**.

Pick **your books** up.  
Pick up **your books**.

When the object of the two-part verb is a pronoun, it can only come between the verb and the particle:

Turn **the TV** down.  
Turn down **the TV**.  
Turn **it** down.

Pick **your books** up.  
Pick up **your books**.  
Pick **them** up.

### Responding Requests with Will

You can use will to respond to a request:

- Could you turn on the lights?  
- Sure, I'll turn them on.

- Can you let the dog out?  
- Yes, I'll let it out in a minute.

### Requests with Would you mind...?

Would you mind + verb + -ing + comp. + ? => Would you mind **picking me up** at the airport?

Would you mind + not + verb + -ing + comp. + ? => Would you mind **not smoking** in here?
